






WAUNETA CHAMBER OUTSTANDING CUSTOMER SERVICE AWARD

Recipes by Rhonda

Pig Shots

1 pound smoked sausage or kielbasa sausage, cut into ¼ inch chunks

12 ounce thick cut bacon

4-ounce cream cheese, room temperature

¼ cup sour cream

1 jalapeno, stem, seeds removed, diced

½ cup sharp cheddar cheese

½ teaspoon Slap Ya Mama seasoning

¼ cup BBQ Sauce

1/8 cup honey

1 ½ teaspoon brown sugar

Jalapeno slices



Preheat the oven to 375 degrees.

In a small bowl, mix BBQ sauce, honey and brown sugar together. Set aside.

Cut bacon in half and wrap each piece of smoked sausage with a strip of bacon.

Place into a muffin pan or use a toothpick to hold together and place on a baking sheet. In a medium bowl, mix crem cheese, sour cream, diced jalapeno, sharp cheddar cheese and seasoning together until combined.

Add mixture to a quart size baggie and clip the corner.

Squeeze cheese mixture onto the top of each sausage.

Add a sliced jalapeno on the top and then brush each pig shot with the honey BBQ mixture.

Bake in the oven for 4-45 minutes or until the bacon is crispy.

Carefully remove from the oven and enjoy.

A meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Wauneta, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 6:30 p.m. on **November 14, 2023**, at the Wauneta Village Office.

Pledge of Allegiance was given.

Chairman Johnston publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review.

Present: C Walgren, B Goings, R Einspahr and P Johnston. Absent: B Kramer.

Guests: Arlan Wine (Village Attorney), Stacy Priebe (Edward Jones), Lonnie & Sheila Alexander and Leanne Klein (Wauneta EMS).

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Imperial Republican on Nov 9, 2023. Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to the Chairman and all the Trustees. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Board approved the minutes of the regular meeting of the Village Board of Trustees, held on Oct 10, 2023.

Board approved the Treasurer's Report (Oct) and approved bills (Nov) as presented.

Stacy Priebe, Edward Jones, reviewed the investment portfolios for the Chateau Theatre and made recommendations to the Village Board to change the current structure. The Board voted to change the structure of the investments with Edward Jones from "Advisory Solutions" to "Guided Solutions", and to reiterate that the Village Clerk and the Chairman of the Board are the authorized signers. This would allow the local Edward Jones office to manage the portfolio.

Board member Einspahr introduced Ordinance No. 2023-03, an ordinance to vacate a part of Center Street, between Lot 1, Block 1 and Lot 1, Block 2, Sunrise Heights Addition. Clerk Skelton read the Ordinance by title:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF WAUNETA, NEBRASKA, TO VACATE A PART OF CENTER STREET, BETWEEN LOT 1, BLOCK 1, SUNRISE HEIGHTS ADDITION AND LOT 1, BLOCK 2, SUNRISE HEIGHTS ADDITION TO THE VILLAGE OF WAUNETA, CHASE COUNTY, NEBRASKA; RESERVING A RIGHT-OF-WAY FOR PUBLIC UTILITIES; PROVIDING FOR REVERSION OF THE OWNERSHIP THEREOF: TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS OR PARTS THEREOF IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND TO PROVIDE FOR PUBLICATION AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE.

The Board suspended the Statutory Rule requiring reading on three different days of said Ordinance. The Board then passed and adopted Ordinance No. 2023-03.

Board authorized Hunter Heating & Cooling to install an air conditioner and furnace in the Ambulance Building Office area based on quote in the amount of \$14,950.00; and to refurbish 2 existing tube heaters in the bay area for an estimated cost of \$2,000.00.

Einspahr and Johnston reviewed Financial Reports (Sept) and the Nursing Home Committee Meeting Report with the Village Board.

Board approved the renewal of Group Health Insurance as presented (BCBS) for the Nursing Home.

Board approved a wage increase for Gary Hunt, Nursing Home Maintenance Supervisor, as recommended by WCTC Administration.

The Board reviewed the Sheriff's Report for October 2023.

Board approved an invoice from Maguire Iron, in the amount of \$78,900.00, for work done through October 30, 2023 (cleaning and painting the water reservoir).

Board approved sharing cost 50/50 with the Wauneta Chamber for the cost of candy for Santa Saturday.

Lawless and Skelton gave the Village Board an update on the status of identified Nuisance properties.

Clerk's Report was given by Skelton.

Superintendent's Report was given by Lawless.
