



Recipes from Rhonda

Cherry Tarts

16 oz cream cheese, softened ³/₄ c sugar 2 eggs, slightly beaten

2 tsp vanilla18 vanilla wafers1 can cherry pie filling

Blend together the softened cream cheese, sugar, beaten eggs and vanilla until smooth. Line cupcake pans with papers and place 1 vanilla wafer in each paper. Spoon the cream cheese mixture over the wafer, dividing the mixture between 18 cups. Bake at 350 degrees for 15 minutes. Cool. Spread cherry pie filling over the top of each cooled tart.

1 Can cherry pie filling 8 Oz can crushed pineapple 1 ½ mini marshmallows 16 oz whipped topping.

1/4 to 1/2 c pecan pieces
1 Can sweetened condensed milk
Few drops red food coloring (opt)

Board approved invoice from Miller & Associates in the amount of \$19,300.00 for professional fees relating to the Emergency Water Main Replacement.

Chairman Johnston reviewed NH Financial Reports for Nov 2022 and the Committee Meeting Report with the Village Board.

Board went into executive session for a strategy session with respect to possible litigation as evidenced by a claim against WCTC. The Village Board entered executive session at 7:26 pm. The Board came out of executive session at 7:42 pm.

Board approved to instruct our consulting firm, RHD, to make an offer of \$1,500.00 in response to a claim against WCTC.
