RECIPES BY RHONDA

DORITOS CHICKEN CASSEROLE

Ingredients Cooking spray soup

- 1 (9.75 0z) bag Nacho Cheese Doritos, divided
- 2 cups sour cream
- 2 cups salsa
- 3 cups rotisserie chicken, shredded (from 1 chicken)



(10.5 oz) can cream of chicken

6 medium-sized flour tortillas, divided

- 1 (1 oz) package of taco seasoning, divided
- 1 (10 oz) can diced tomatoes with green chiles
- 1 (8 oz) package Mexican shredded cheese blend, divided

Toppings optional:

Sour cream, shredded lettuce, shredded cheese, chopped cilantro, diced tomatoes, chopped onion, additional Crushed Doritos or tortilla chips.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a 13 x 9 in casserole dish with cooking spray.

Crush 2 cups of Doritos in a large zip-top plastic bag. Stir together sour cream and salsa in a medium bowl. Combine crushed chips, ½ cup of salsa mixture and shredded rotisserie chicken in the large zip-top plastic bag and shake until chicken is evenly coated. Set remaining salsa mixture aside.

Layer Casserole:

Lay two medium-sized tortillas in the bottom of the prepared casserole dish. Sprinkle tortillas with 2 teasponns of the taco seasoning. Sprinkle 1/3 of the Doritos-coated chicken on top of tortillas.

Stir cream of chicken soup into remaining salsa/sour cream mixture. Spread 1/3 of mixture over chicken. Scatter 1/3 of the diced tomatoes and green chiles over salsa mixture. Sprinkle $\frac{1}{4}$ of the cheese on top.

Repeat layering 2 more times using all of the remaining tortillas, chicken, salsa mixture, and diced tomatoes and green chiles. Top with the remaining cheese. Crush the rest of the Doritos on top of the cheese.

Cover loosely with foil. Bake for 20 minutes. Remove foil. Bake for 10 additional minutes or until the cheese starts to brown and the casserole is heated through. Serve with toppings on the side.





A meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Wauneta, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 6:30 p.m. on **June 10, 2025,** at the Village Office.

Pledge of Allegiance was given.

Chairman Johnston publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review.

Present: C Walgren, K Kerchal, R Einspahr, P Johnston. Absent: B Kramer.

Guests: Arlan Wine (Village Attorney) and Reese West.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Imperial Republican on June 5, 2025. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Board approved the minutes of the regular meeting of the Village Board of Trustees, held on May 13, 2025; and approved the minutes of the special meeting of the Board of Trustees, held on May 16, 2025.

Board approved Treasurer's Report (May) and approved bills (June) as presented.

Reese West came to update the Village Board on the efforts to clean up the property at 122 N Tecumseh (building was burned down in January 2025).

Kerchal and Einspahr reviewed the Nursing Home Financial Reports for April 2025 with the Village Board and gave a report on the Committee meeting held with RaNae Richardson, WCTC Administrator, and Doug Chos, RHD representative.

The Board authorized the purchase of a new food warmer for the nursing home, \$1,559.00 plus cost of wheels and shipping (based on recommendation of Dietary Department).

Board authorized Richardson (WCTC Administrator) to invest \$100,000 in a Certificate of Deposit with Sandhills State Bank, under terms that she finds most agreeable.

A special meeting will be held on June 18, 2025 (time to be determined) to review and approve the 2025-2026 Budget for the nursing home.

The Board reviewed the Chase County Sheriff's Report for May 2025.

Board approved the 2025 Wage Schedule for Pool and Summer employees, as follows:

Manager \$14.75 – 16.00/hr
Asst Manager/4th year \$14.25 – 14.50/hr
3rd year guard \$14.00/hr
2nd year guard \$13.75/hr

2nd year guard \$13.75/hr 1st year guard \$13.50/hr (additional 0.25 for pool operator certification)

Board approved a proposal from B&H Paving to chip seal streets, for a cost of \$20,900.00.

Board approved the estimate from Baxter Concrete for \$7,835.00 to repair (upgrade to cement) the walking path east of the tennis courts (220 ft from the covered shelter to the tennis courts entrance). Discussed possible other improvements to the walking path. (Extend path from playground to gazebo)

The Board discussed using West Central Nebraska Development District (WCNDD) as an option for nuisance abatement. WCNDD will be invited to attend a board meeting to give a presentation on this service.

Discussed procedures for the collection of the special assessment for nuisance abatement against the Ourada property. Discussed procedures for assessing fines and penalties to other nuisance properties.

Board members Einspahr and Johnston will serve on a committee with the Chase County Commissioners to explore options for Ambulance Building renovations.
