



A meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Wauneta, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 6:30 p.m. on **May 9, 2023,** at the Village Office.

Pledge of Allegiance was given.

Chairman Johnston publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Imperial Republican on May 4, 2023. Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to the Chairman and all the Trustees. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Board approved the minutes of the regular meeting of the Village Board of Trustees, held on April 11, 2023.

Board approved Treasurer's Report (April) and bills (May) as presented.

David Blau, Miller & Assoc, reported to the Village Board that the water main replacement portion of the Emergency Water Main Replacement is done. Final pay applications will be presented at next month's meeting.

Board approved an invoice from Miller & Assoc, in the amount of \$5,393.51, for Emergency Water Main Replacement.

Board approved Pay App. No. 3, payable to BSB Construction, in the amount of \$25,326.19, for Emergency Water Main Replacement.

RaNae Richardson, WCTC, reviewed the Nursing Home Financial Reports for April 2023 with the Village Board and gave a report on the Committee meeting held on May 8, 2023.

Board approved the "Title VI Non-Discrimination Plan" for the Nursing Home. Voting Aye: Kramer, Einspahr and Johnston.

Board approved the Nursing Home Leadership Annual raises to D. Stehno, S. Sutherland and V. Nelson, as recommended by the Nursing Home Administration.

Board approved improvements of adding screening and fencing to the Basketball/pickleball courts More research will be done on lighting options.

Board approved Pay App. No. Final 2, payable to Hunter Heating and Cooling, in the amount of \$4,581.00, regarding the HVAC Project at the Nursing Home.

The Board reviewed the Chase County Sheriff's report for April 2023.

Board approved the Insurance Policy Renewal (HomeTown Agency) and payment for the annual premium of \$60,722.50. (Einspahr abstained)

Board approved an invoice from Titan Machinery in the amount of \$37,000 for purchase of 2023 Backhoe (590SN).

Board approved to offer the position of Utilities Superintendent to Shane Lawless, on a probation period of 6 months, effective June 1, 2023, at a salary of \$58,000 annually plus benefits as established.

Einspahr discussed the new committee for Housing Renovation in Wauneta with the Village Board.



Margaret Metcalf Howie bequeathal provides for ongoing care of Wauneta's Riverside Cemetery

Wauneta native Margaret Metcalf Howie made sure to remember her hometown in her will in a way that would benefit the town and honor her family with a lasting legacy. Margaret worked with the Nebraska Community Foundation to establish an endowment to make sure there would always be money available for maintenance and improvements at the Wauneta Cemetery. The \$67,000 endowment was designated to the Wauneta Community Fund, an affiliated fund of the Nebraska Community Foundation. Wauneta's Fund Advisory Committee will oversee that disbursement of money from the endowment to the Village of Wauneta for use at the cemetery on an ongoing basis. Disbursements will become available in fiscal year 2024.

Margaret was born in Wauneta, NE in 1931, a great-granddaughter of Nebraska homesteaders. She graduated from Wauneta High School in 1948, winning a Regents' Scholarship to the University of Nebraska. She received a B.A. degree with a dual major in Anthropology and English in 1952. She worked for the Missouri River Basin Survey after graduating, doing salvage archeology at dam sites in the Dakotas. She went on to attend the University of Denver where she received the M.A. degree in Library Science in 1954. Margaret began working at the University of Denver Mary Reed Library, and then became a reference librarian in the Western History Department of the Denver Public Library.

She married John Howie in 1956; son Stephen was born in 1960. After an interval as a homemaker, Margaret resumed her career as a part-time cataloguer at the Hugh Stephens Library of Stephens College in Columbia, Missouri, in 1969. She went full-time two years later, and became Head of Technical Services in 1977. During the following years she supervised the transition from the traditional card catalog to an electronic cataloguing system, frequently visiting other libraries around the country to observe their systems and confer with their staffs.

John Howie died suddenly in 1990. Margaret retired in 1993. She continued to live in Columbia until she realized that "almost everyone I knew here had either moved away or died." In 2004 she moved back to Lincoln to be close to friends from college. Margaret died in October 2021. She is survived by her son, Stephen, of Lincoln.

Margaret's mother, Elizabeth Pepper Metcalf, died when Margaret was just a baby. She was raised by her father, noted Wauneta archeologist Dr. George S. Metcalf, and an extended family of aunts and uncles and cousins including the Olivers, Christensens, Fannings, Novaceks and Metcalfs.

Dr. George S. Metcalf, one of Wauneta's most distinguished native sons, was a field archeologist, a historian of the Great Plains, and a supervisor of the processing laboratory of the Department of

Anthropology at the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D.C. He was born in a sod house near Wauneta in 1900 and began collecting artifacts during his boyhood along the Frenchman River and its tributaries in southwest Nebraska.

Although his formal education ended in the eighth grade, he became a professional archeologist. He authored numerous published articles, reports and bulletins in the course of his career. In 1970, he was awarded an honorary ScD. by Luther College. That same year, Metcalf was sent by the Smithsonian as its representative to help catalog the Gavin Sampson collection of artifacts at Luther College in Decorah, Iowa. During his time at Luther, Metcalf developed cataloging procedures and helped train students in basic laboratory techniques. Dr. Metcalf died in 1975. Both of Margaret's parents are buried at Riverside Cemetery as are many of her aunts, uncles, cousins and friends.

Margaret's roots in Chase County date back long before Chase County was established. Her great-grandfather, Stephen McElroy, headed up the surveying party sent to this region when it was still populated by Native Americans. The surveying crew of McElroy, Fairchild and Wells was dispatched to this area in the early 1870s by by the U.S. government to establish section lines and townships for future development. When they arrived, they found an Indian village nearby, ruled by Chief Whistler, who asked the surveyors to leave. They continued their work, however. In the night, the Indians pulled the stakes and destroyed the markings and military protection became necessary for McElroy and his surveying crew to continue their work. When an inspector later inquired to the lack of precision in staking out the area, McElroy replied, "If you had to divide your attention between your instruments and your rifle, you might not be too accurate either.

RECIPES BY RHONDA

Barbecued Beef on Buns

1 Boneless beef chuck roast

1 Medium onion

½ Cup chopped celery

Water

1 ½ Cups of ketchup

¼ Cup packed brown sugar

¼ Cup Vinegar

2 TBSP dry mustard

2 tsp salt

2 tsp Worcestershire sauce

1 tsp Chili powder

½ tsp Paprika

½ tsp garlic salt

few drops hot pepper sauce or chopped jalapenos

Hamburger Buns

Place beef, onion and celery in a Dutch oven; add water to almost cover the roast. Bring to a boil; reduce heat. Cover and simmer for 2 ½ to 3 hours or until meat is tender. Remove meat; strain and reserve cooking liquid. Trim and shred meat; return to Dutch oven. Add 2 cups of strained cooking liquid (save remaining liquid) and chill. Skim and discard fat. Add ketchup, brown sugar, vinegar and seasonings. Cover and simmer for 1 hour, Stirring occasionally. If mixture becomes too thick, add additional reserved cooking liquid. Serve on hamburger buns. Yields 15-20 Servings.
