
## Nurturing News from Wauneta Care and Therapy Center

## RECIPES BY RHONDA

### LUCIOUS LIME ANGEL SQUARES

**1 pkg (3oz) lime gelatin**  
**1 cup boiling water**  
**1 prepared angel food cake (8 in) cut into 1 in cubes**  
**1 pkg (8 oz) cream cheese softened**  
**½ cup sugar**  
**2 tsp lemon juice**  
**1 ½ tsp grated lemon zest**  
**1 carton (8 oz) frozen whipped topping, thawed (4 ½ cups)**  
**Lime slices, optional**



**In a small bowl, dissolve gelatin in boiling water. Refrigerate until the mixture just begins to thicken, about 35 minutes. Place cake cubes in a greased 13x9 in dish.**

**In a small bowl, beat cream cheese until smooth. Beat in sugar, and lemon juice and zest. Add gelatin mixture, beat until combined. Fold in 1 ½ cups whipped topping.**

**Spread over top of cake, covering completely. Refrigerate for at least 2 hours or until firm. Cut into squares top with remainin whipped topping. If desired , garnish with lime slices.**

A meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Wauneta, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 6:30 p.m. on **February 11, 2025**, at the Wauneta Village Office.

Pledge of Allegiance was given.

Chairman Johnston publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review.

Present: Beau Kramer, Crystal Walgren, Kathy Kerchal and Page Johnston.

Absent: Rick Einspahr

Guests: Mike Dukes (Chase County Deputy) and Arlan Wine (Village Attorney).

Clerk Skelton administered the Oath of Office to newly appointed trustee, Kathy Kerchal.

Board approved the minutes of the regular meeting of the Village Board of Trustees, held on January 14, 2025.

Board approved the Treasurer's Report (Jan) and approved bills (Feb) as presented.

Kramer reviewed Nursing Home Financial Reports for Dec 2024 and the Committee Meeting Report with the Village Board. The Nursing Home Strategic Planning Session is scheduled for Feb 21, 2025, at 10:00 am.

Reviewed the January Sheriff's Report with Deputy Mike Dukes.

Board member Kramer introduced Ordinance No. 2025-01:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF WAUNETA, NEBRASKA, PROVIDING FOR THE PROHIBITION OF ENGINE BREAKING; ADDING SUBSECTION 5-221 TO CHAPTER 5 – TRAFFIC, OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF WAUNETA; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ANY AND ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH THIS ORDINANCE; AND TO DECLARE AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

The Board suspended the Statutory Rule requiring reading on three different days; and approves the final passage of Ordinance No. 2025-01.

Board approved the updated "Emergency Plan" for the Village of Wauneta, Water System.

The Board discussed ongoing nuisance properties and cargo container zoning requirements.

Clerk's Report was given by Skelton. Skelton has requested a proposal from JK Energy Consulting for an Electric Rate Study.

Superintendent's Report was given by Lawless.
