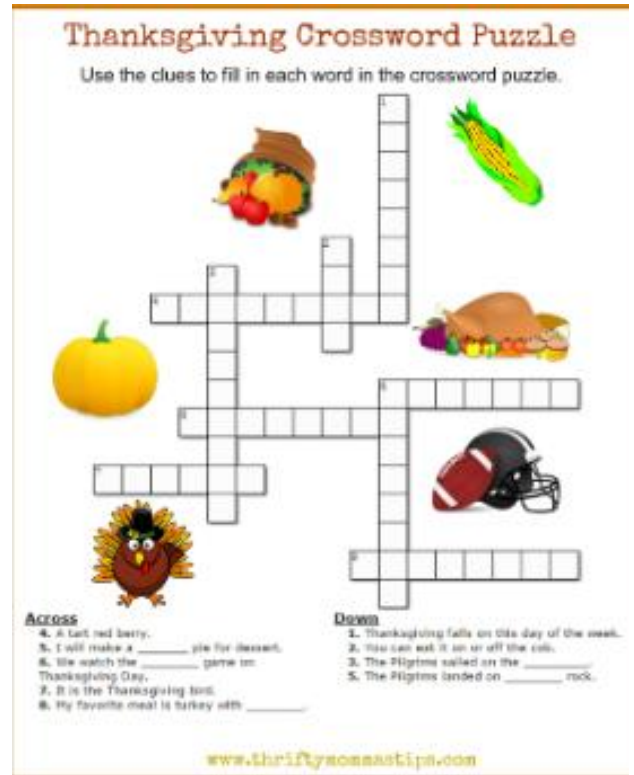

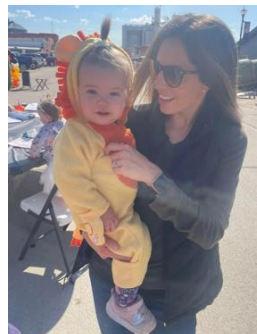

## RECIPES BY RHONDA

### SLOW COOKER LASAGNA

1 pound of ground beef	1 tsp salt
1 large onion, chopped	1tsp dried oregano
2 garlic cloves, minced	1 package (8 ounces) no cook lasagna noodles
1 can (29 ounces) tomato sauce	4 cups (16 ounces) shredded mozzarella cheese
1 cup water	1 ½ cups (12 ounces) small curd cottage cheese
1 can (6 ounces) tomato paste	½ cup grated Parmesan cheese

In a skillet, cook beef, onion and garlic over medium heat until meat is no longer pink; drain. Add the tomato sauce, water, tomato paste, salt and oregano; mix well. Spread a fourth of the meat sauce in an ungreased 5-qt slow cooker. Arrange a third of the noodles over sauce (break the noodles if necessary). Combine the cheeses; spoon a third of the mixture over noodles. Repeat layers twice. Top with remaining meat sauce. Cover and cook on low for 4-5 hours or until noodles are tender.

Notice of this meeting was given in advance to all members of the Board of Education. The Secretary of the Board maintains a list of the news media requesting notification of the meetings and advance notification to the listed media of the time and place of the meeting and the subjects to be discussed at this meeting was provided. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the publicized notice and a current copy of the Agenda was maintained as stated in the publicized notice. All proceedings of the Board of Education, except as may be hereinafter noted, were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.
