Recipes by Rhonda

Cookies and Cream Brownies

1 ½ cups sugar

34 cup flour

½ cup unsweetened cocoa powder

½ tsp salt

14 tsp baking powder

¾ cup unsalted butter

3 eggs

1 tsp Vanilla

32 Oreos divided

1-8 oz cool whip thawed

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a 9-inch baking dish.

Mix sugar, flour, cocoa powder, salt and baking powder together in a mixing bowl.

Whisk butter, eggs and vanilla together in a separate bowl. Add butter mixture to flour mixture until well combined.

Pour $\frac{1}{2}$ of batter into the baking dish and smooth out with a spatula. Add 16 Oreo cookies in an even layer (4 rows of 4 cookies) then spread the remaining batter over top.

Bake in the preheated oven until the edges are brown and the center is set, 30 to 35 minutes.

Remove pan from oven and set on wire rack. Let Brownies cool completely, at least 30 minutes.

Crush 12 of the remaining Oreo cookies. Place cool whip in a bowl and fold in the crushed cookies. Spread over the top of the Brownies. Crush the remaining 4 cookies and sprinkle on top. Keep refrigerated until ready to serve.

Overnight Blueberry French Toast

12 slices day old bread, cut into 1 inch cubes

2 – 8 oz packages cream cheese cut into 1-inch cubes

1 cup fresh blueberries

12 eggs beaten

2 cups of milk

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1/3 cup maple syrup

Blueberry Sauce:

1 cup sugar

1 cup water

2 TBSP cornstarch.

1 cup fresh blueberries

1 TBSP Butter

Prepare Casserole:

Lightly grease a 9x13 inch baking dish. Arrange ½ of the bread cubes in the dish and top with cream cheese cubes, sprinkle the blueberries over the cream cheese, then top with remaining bread cubes.

Whisk eggs, milk, vanilla extract and syrup together in a large bowl until well combined; pour over the bread cubes. Cover and refrigerate overnight.

Remove casserole from refrigerator about 30 minutes before baking. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Bake casserole in the oven, covered for 30 minutes. Uncover, and continue to bake until center is firm, and surface is lightly browned, about 25 to 30 minutes.

Meanwhile, prepare blueberry sauce. Mix sugar, water and cornstarch together in a medium pan; bring to a boil and cook, stirring constantly, 3 to 4 minutes. Stir in blueberries, reduce heat to low, simmer until all blueberries burst, about 10 minutes. Stir in butter. Serve portions of casserole on plates and pour warm syrup over the top.



Wauneta Global Methodist Church Welcomes Pastor Brian Loy.

The new pastor of the Wauneta and Imperial Methodist Church is Rev. Brian G. Loy. Rev. Loy comes to Wauneta and Imperial from Lakin, Kansas where he served the Lakin United Methodist Church, Lakin Kansas. He has been in full time ministry for the past 13 years.

Pastor Loy grew up in O'Neill, Nebraska. His father was the pastor there from 1976 to 1983. He followed in his footsteps some 34 years later. Pastor Loy lived in the same house he grew up in during his adolescence years. Pastor Loy is single and has two children. His son Brandon, wife Erika and two daughters live near Bushnell Nebraska where Brandon is a rancher while Erika works in the Pine Bluffs Wyoming School System and is a homemaker. Pastor Loy's daughter Lacey and her husband Cardinal, live in Gering with her two sons and one daughter and another daughter on the way. Lacey works as a school psychologist in the Gering School system where she graduated. Cardinal works for the state of Nebraska.

Before his move to Lakin, he was serving as the pastor in O'Neill, Chambers, Atkinson and Amelia during this time. While there he was serving four churches. However, for personal reasons he stepped down from two of those churches, and after his father announced his retirement in Elgin, knowing how finding pastors can be difficult, he found a way to help out the Elgin church. "When they couldn't find a pastor to come here to Elgin, I contacted the district superintendent and said 'Hey, if you don't have anybody I'd be interested if they work on realigning their worship service.' And low and behold here I am." Pastor Loy said.

Being a pastor has been something he always wanted to do since high school. "I always admired the work that my father did with people in leading them to a changed life" Brian said. So, he began his path in becoming a pastor in 1981, but it soon came to a halt once he started pursuing successful business ventures. "After 30 plus years of being successful, I still wasn't at peace and happy" he explained. "And so, I found myself on a country road and pulled into a little church, recommitted my life to Christ, and began the ministry track and haven't looked back."

His favorite part about being in the ministry has been "seeing people who are lost and hurting come to a saving grace with Jesus Christ." However, there are also downsides to being in the ministry. "Standing before a family that just lost a loved one, and that was killed in an alcohol-related accident and trying to explain and make sense of that." That is extremely hard to do.

Pastor Loy enjoys spending his free time with family. "We can go camping, visiting a theme park or simply sitting around the house playing games and visiting. Anything is a possibility as long as it is being done together." Two Christmas' ago we spent it at the Hart Ranch in South Dakota. My son said it best..... "Dad, maybe we didn't spend a lot of money for this Christmas, but we sure made a lot of memories!"

Pastor Loy's hobbies are playing golf, working in agriculture businesses, farms and ranches, and traveling seeing new areas of this country. I also enjoy studying anything of learning value. I am a license local pastor and that requires an ongoing continuing education learning system. One other passion he has is, and I hope to pursue soon, is the attainment of my private plane license.

Village of Wauneta, Nebraska

A meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Wauneta, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 6:30 p.m. on August 8, 2023, at the Wauneta Village Office.

Pledge of Allegiance was given.

Chairman Johnston publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review.

Present: B Goings, R Einspahr and P Johnston. Absent: B Kramer and C Walgren.

Guests: Allison Sandman (WP School), Kent Cordes (BD Construction), Arlan Wine (Village Attorney), and Shane Lawless.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Imperial Republican on August 3, 2023. Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to the Chairman and all the Trustees. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Village Board discussed and reviewed a "Grant of License" to W-P Schools for use of right-of-way for parking. Also discussed cost-share for additional intersection work at Wauneta Attendance Center with Allison Sandman (WP School) and Kent Cordes (BD Construction). No action was taken. Chairman Johnston would like all Board members to be present to take any type of action.

Board approved the minutes of the regular meeting of the Village Board of Trustees, held on July 11, 2023.

Board approved the Treasurer's Report (July) and bills (Aug) as presented.

Johnston reviewed Financial Reports (June) and the Nursing Home Committee Meeting Report with the Village Board.

Board approved the recommend wage increase by Nursing Home administration for a dept head employee, effective July 1, 2023.

The Village Board reviewed an agreement for Dundy County Hospital to lease space for a Satellite Clinic at the Nursing Home. The consensus from the Board was to allow the Nursing Home to move forward and work out the details and finalize an agreement. The final lease will need to be approved by the Village Board.

The Board reviewed the Sheriff's Reports for August 2023.

Board member Goings introduced Ordinance No. 2023-01, an ordinance to vacate the south twenty feet of Ponca Street from the east side of Arikaree Avenue to the Frenchman River. Clerk Skelton read the Ordinance by title:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF WAUNETA, NEBRASKA, TO VACATE THE SOUTH TWENTY FEET OF PONCA STREET FROM THE EAST SIDE OF ARIKAREE AVENUE TO THE FRENCHMAN RIVER; RESERVING A RIGHT-OF-WAY FOR PUBLIC UTILITIES; PROVIDING FOR REVERSION OF THE OWNERSHIP THEREOF: TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS OR PARTS THEREOF IN CONTACT HEREWITH; AND TO PROVIDE FOR PUBLICATION AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE.

The Board suspended the Statutory Rule requiring reading on three different days for consideration of said Ordinance. The Board then passed and adopted Ordinance No. 2023-01.

Board accepted Marsha Cameron's letter of resignation as the Library Director for the Wauneta Public Library, effective August 14, 2023; and approved the Library Board's recommendation to hire Amanda Ziegler as the new Library Director.

The Board discussed establishing set rates for mowing and cleanup of nuisance properties. With direction from the Board a resolution will be presented at the next Board meeting to set such rates.

Clerk's Report was given by Skelton. Skelton reported donations received:

- Anonymous \$4,000.00, designated for the pool
- Hometown Agency \$636.00 funds from the Harvest Fest lunch, designated for the Community Building
- Wauneta Chamber \$200.00 and Brenda Anderson \$250.00, designated for rubber mats for Disc Golf
